



Coeur d'Alene Public Schools uses IStation to diagnose potential difficulties in reading and provided specialized supports. This visual guide will assist you in setting up and using Istation Home, which will allow your child to access the Istation curriculum if they have been granted an instructional license.

<p>Step 1: Go to the Web site www.istation.com and click on Services and Support. Click the appropriate button to download Istation for Windows or Macintosh. iPad and Chromebook applications can be downloaded on the device from the corresponding app store.</p>	
<p>Step 2: Click on the Imagination Station icon located on your desktop</p>	
<p>Step 3: Click on the desktop app. The first time you log in, you will be prompted to type your child's school name in the domain field. Domain name format is school.district.state (e.g., mcnaire.dallas.tx).</p> <p><i>If you have students at different campuses, they will need to log in under different domains. This can be done two ways:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Type in the following login information: Username: config Password: config Enter the correct campus or domain for the student logging in, then click OK. 2. Download the program a second time and set it up with the domain for the specific campus. You will then want to save this file to a new location. Contact Support for assistance. 	

Step 4:

- Enter your user name and password provided by your classroom teacher.
- Click the **OK** button.

Step 5:

Select one of the following:

- Reading with ISIP – personalized instructional path
- Reading *en Español* con ISIP* – personalized instructional path
- Books – interactive books
- Writing – Writing Rules! with Calvin Cool (3rd – 8th grade)
- iPractice – student-selected activities from the Istation curriculum
- Assignments – extra practice activities assigned by the teacher

ISIP™ Reading comprehension scores are now correlated to Lexile reader measures. Students are given a Lexile score every time they take the ISIP comprehension subtest. To find books that are in the range of your child’s reading ability use the Find A Book link. Find A Book>>

A student virtual library is available in Istation. The library contains the books that your child has previously read in the program. You can allow your child to re-read these books on his or her own, read them to you, or print them to read later. The library can be accessed by having your child click the “Books” button after logging into the program on the computer.
