## Principal's Message.....

We would like to invite all parents to our 2nd semester Parent Conference Night on the evening of Wednesday, March 8th at 4:00pm. We provide this after school format to allow the opportunity for all our parents to meet with teachers after the six-week grading period. Parents can go online and view course progress then attend the parent conference night. This is an open invitation night, no appointments with teachers are necessary. Please print your student's class schedule and bring it with you the night of conferences. We look forward to having parents here at school with us.

It is our strong view that early intervention is the very best option for dealing with students who are having academic difficulties. If you are unable to attend our parent conference night but would like to make arrangements for a conference, please feel free to contact teachers directly either by phone or email. Parents have online access to attendance and grades, as well as email updates of student progress by visiting <http://skyward.cdaschools.org>. Our online grading system allows parents and students to view attendance and academic progress in real time. Teachers have been asked to post grades on a regular basis.

Grades are updated approximately every two weeks. Please allow us to assist you if you have any concerns. If your child is struggling they can access our after-school tutoring program. On March 20 and 21 Lake City High School will be hosting 8 administrators from across the region for an assessment of our school. AdvancEd Accreditation will conduct interviews of our district administrators, speak to parents, students and staff groups and conduct observations in our classrooms. This is a requirement of our accreditation process. Our building leadership team has worked diligently to collect evidence spanning 5 standards of achievement. In the last several months we have conducted surveys of our students, staff and community members. Your input was critical to this process. Thank you all for your involvement!

It could be argued that we're approaching the most crucial time of the year for the students at Lake City High School. From March 20th through May 26th students will be taking their spring ISAT (English Language Arts and Math). Not only will the ISAT exams measure the academic progress of our students from last spring to this spring, but it will eventually be a requirement to graduate. As we approach this testing window, there will be more information available. We encourage all students to prepare thoroughly, rest well, and do their very best. Please help us prepare your kids for the ISAT.

Our counseling department is presently preparing for registration in all classes including the incoming 8th grade classes from Woodland, Canfield, and Lakes Middle Schools. The registration process will begin at the end of April. As registration information arrives in your home, please discuss preferred courses with your student for the 2017-2018 school year.

Amazingly, we are getting closer to the end of another school year; recognizing and honoring our seniors for their accomplishments and getting to know the new group of 8th grade students who will join us from Woodland, Canfield, Lakes, and other schools.

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
## 15th Annual Spring Craft and Garden Show at Lake City High School Saturday, March 18, 2017 from 9a.m. – 4p.m.

The primary fundraiser for this event is the **15th Annual Spring Craft and Garden Show** which will be held in the Lake City High School Gym and Commons Areas on Saturday, March 18, 2017. Artists and vendors from all over the Northwest will showcase hand-crafted personal items, fabulous gift ideas, purses and jewelry, photography, pottery, wood carvings and more! Enjoy gourmet concessions, live entertainment all day, a bake sale and an hourly raffle while you shop.

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## FROM THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE... 90% ATTENDANCE RULE

A student who accrues five or more days of absences in any class shall lose credit for the semester. Credit will be reinstated when: a) the student passes an end-of-course assessment (EOCA) in which the student has lost credit, and b) the student has a passing grade for the course.

If a student takes the EOCA and consequently loses credit, he/she may appeal to an academic committee if said student feels he/she has the minimum competency in the course work, but that was not reflected in the exam, and there are extenuating circumstances for violating the 90% attendance rule. The exam must be taken before any appeals will be granted.

Courses which are performance based, such as music, Drama, technology, P.E., professional-technical, aide positions or YVA, may choose to have evaluations in which the student performs or presents a portfolio of semester work.

Work missed due to excused absences will be made up at a time to be arranged by the teacher/department.

Absences will be dealt with through a series of steps that include parent notification and conferences. Disciplinary action will be taken when unexcused absenteeism occurs. These actions may include: Detention, In-School Suspension, Night School, Out-of-School Suspension, Notification to Prosecutor's office as Habitual Truant, Driver's License Suspension.

**If your son/daughter has an appointment during the school day, it will expedite the student checkout if they bring their excuse note to the attendance office first thing in the morning. They will get their pass at that time. When they need to leave, they will then present the pass to their teacher and they can be on their way. Calling in to excuse your son/daughter for an appointment is not necessarily the fastest process.**

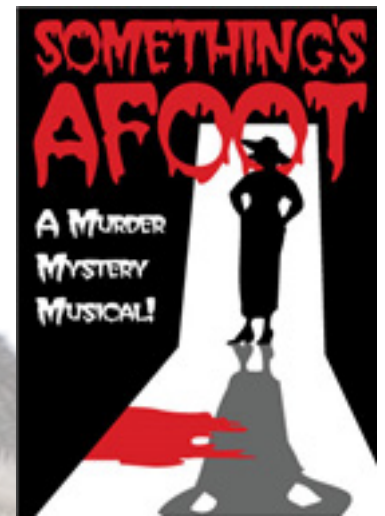
