Explores how students can begin the process to achieve financial security by starting in their early years (like NOW). This is primarily a short course about planning and decision making, understanding the time value of money, and generally giving students skills and knowledge that they need but often don't receive formally. Topics should be student-initiated, and will likely address budgeting, saving, investing, "living your best life", starting a business, etc. A portion of the class will probably be spent discussing taxation and tax policies as well.

Current Events - What is going on in the world and what does it mean?!?

This 9-12th grade reading and discussion class explores current events going on in the US and around the world. We will read, watch, and discuss events of student interest as they are reported by a variety of media sources. Some time will be spent learning to evaluate media sources (and learning about resources to help with that evaluation), examining how various appeals (logic, ethics, emotion) are made to audiences, and exploring the effects and effectiveness of those appeals on individuals and larger communities. Some class time will also be spent chronicling the evolution of students' thinking about topics of interest in order to increase their awareness of their own learning processes.

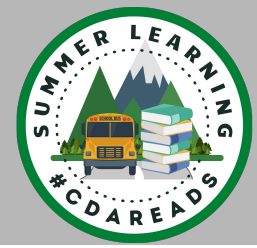

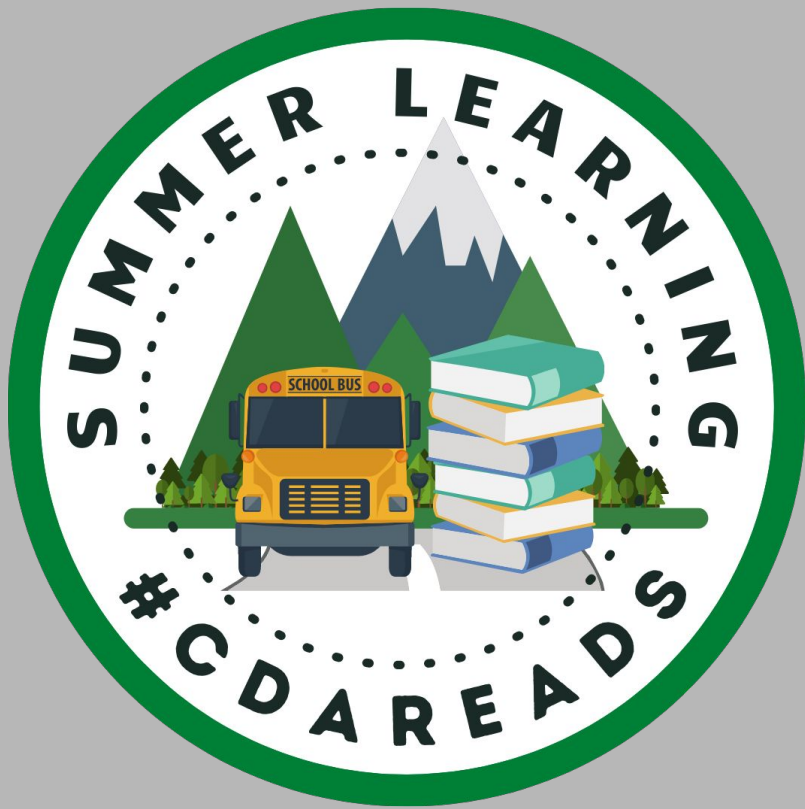
