Our final screening window of the year opens Monday (students can assess any time between May 3-31) for the following assessments:

- Civics this is the last regular window of the year for students to take their civics assessment;
- I-Ready Mathematics a diagnostic assessment will be automatically assigned to all students in grades 06-08 (excluding those taking Math 1);
- Illuminate Fastbridge a screening assessment will be provided to all students in English language arts in grades 06-12 and students taking high school mathematics (excluding AP);
- IStation Reading a reading screener will be provided to all elementary students. The results of which will comprise the Idaho Reading Indicator.

We look forward to sharing these results along with initial results from the ISAT presented by Smarter Balanced with you in June.

Nichole Piekarski - Summary Of COVID Activity:

4/19-25

11 cases

In-District: Increased COVID activity in students grades K-5 and 9-12 and staff grades K-5.

4/26-5/3 incomplete

14 cases to-date on 4/30.

In-District: Increased COVID activity among students of all grade levels and staff in grades 6-8. 4/30 at 1PM 187 students are quarantined and 6 staff are quarantined

We have a 7-fold increase in COVID activity since March.

Nearly 200 people are quarantined in the District because they were not wearing masks at the time of the exposure. The schools most heavily impacted by quarantines include Bryan, Woodland, and Lake City High School. One cluster outbreak was identified at Winton Elementary School and that class returned to mask wearing for two weeks. We have evidence of in-school spread in other schools, but a cluster has not been confirmed, yet.

Overall, the impression is that fewer people are being tested. When notified of a close contact by the school, several families have related that the exposed individual is currently symptomatic and was last seen at their HCP's office yesterday, but not tested for COVID. The students have been seen for fever, sore throat, headache, or other symptoms and then notified by us that their child was in close contact after their doctor visit. Many of the families are now using the free saliva PCR test we can distribute. But a good number are telling us they won't test because they've been told by their doctor it isn't necessary. We've reached out to Panhandle Health and the Northwest Hospital Alliance for collaboration and problem-solving solutions with provider's offices.

Also, many people believe they have seasonal allergies. One student attended school all 10 days while symptomatic and some of those days were unmasked.

In the community, we hit a low point during spring break from Mar 29- Apr 2. Since then, our community has seen increased case counts, percent positivity, and incidence rate per 100,000 population four weeks in a row. Kootenai County is again among the highest number of cases in Idaho week after week.
