The School Start Times Ad Hoc Committee met on April 22nd over Zoom, and reviewed data from the community survey that went out in February. The committee also voted 11 to 8 to recommend that the School District flip elementary and secondary start times starting with the 2021-22 school year. The committee will meet once more on May 20th to finalize the recommendation and minority report for the June board meeting.

Our kids, who are kind of wearing down from this crazy time, joined forces with their teams via Zoom and came together for 3 1/2 hours and did some great math!



Seth Deniston - Technology Updates:

- We are continuing to check out Chromebooks & Hotspots each Wednesday from 9:00 AM -11:00 AM at CHS. School staff checked out close to 100 devices last week.
- We have also been communicating with families without Internet. Middle and High school students can check out hotspots, and we are starting to open up to some Elementary students as well. Additionally, Wi-fi outside all schools has now become operational for staff and student accounts with maps posted on

- the website: https://www.cdaschools.org/Page/9579. Signage will be posted at parking lot entrances soon. Equipment is also here for Wi-Fi on 5 buses; installation and placement to be decided next.
- Through the Idaho Business for Education (IBE) group, we are working with Intermax on providing internet to the Lakeside, Silver Lake & Riverstone apts. We also talked with Spectrum, and have included details on their offer in communications with families.
- Remote tech support needs are starting to level off, both for students and staff, after the initial high demand for our services.
- We are working on adding functionality to Google Classroom via a third party tool to sync information from Skyward automatically, such as class titles, rosters, and parent/guardian information. We will be implementing additional functionality for the 2020-21 school year and creating classes automatically prior to school starting.

With the approval of the resolution last week allowing students to opt for letter grades in high school coursework, we have created a form that our principals can provide to interested parents/guardians.
