## **Mike Nelson - Letter Grade Requests Summary:**

Our secondary schools continue to receive requests from parents/guardians, electing letter grades for the second semester even after the June 1st deadline. Based on the Board's resolution, building administrators are now establishing review panels that will make determinations in the new school year. However, in reviewing requests received before June 1st, the following data dashboard has been created:

Please note that the dashboard has four pages and you can navigate using the arrows in the upper-left corner.

In summary, there are District-wide discrepancies between the percentage of students selecting letter grades and those qualifying for free-or-reduced lunch, served in special education, and those that are "non-white" in comparison to the population of the District/enrolled secondary schools.

### **Seth Deniston - Technology News:**

Chromebook Sale: Over the last week, we have been communicating with families that checked out a Dell Chromebook for remote learning, offering them an opportunity to purchase for \$25. We also gave an option for them to let us know if this was a hardship, after which they could receive the Chromebook for free, \$5, or \$10. To date we've sold close to 900 Chromebooks, netting close to \$20,000. About 10% of those devices have been at a reduced price or free to families in need. We are still collecting Chromebooks back at the District Office for families who do not want to purchase them.

**Remote Learning Survey for Teachers:** On Wednesday, 6/10, we sent a remote learning survey out to our staff to get feedback to assist with planning and professional development for next school year. We've already received about 150 responses, and will be analyzing the results after it closes on 6/25, as we plan for next year.

**Representation on State Committee: Seth Deniston** was selected to be on the "Digital Divide" task force, a joint subcommittee of the State Board of Education and the Governor's office, looking at ways to provide Internet access, devices, a Learning Management System (LMS) and professional development guidelines and resources to the state. The committee will be meeting at least weekly throughout the summer to provide guidance to school districts.

## Scott Maben - Graduation Live Streaming Success, Facebook Performance:

Looks like livestreaming may be here to stay, at least for our graduation ceremonies. The combined Facebook and YouTube views (live and replay) of the Coeur d'Alene High and Lake City High drive-in ceremonies has topped 16,000 in all. LCHS had more views, and that may be because they opted to carry the livestream on both our District Facebook page and the Lake City United Facebook page. CHS was only on the District page.

We gained close to 300 new Facebook followers over the past week, and now have 8,200. That's strong growth.

Our Facebook engagement (tracking actions people take on our page or posts) remains high. For the week of June 2-8, we had 24,600 engagements, above that of Spokane Public Schools.
