The following data is expected to be presented to the high school redesign committee on Monday, April 26th and was requested by the Board of Trustees at their scheduled workshop on April 19th:

School Aides and Release Time

The following data was pulled from the Skyward Course/Class Counts reports of active courses and active/inactive students for each of the following years. Lake City High School has a "teacher volunteer" course that has been activated, but I'm unsure of the differentiation between their use of "school aide" and "teacher volunteer." Additionally, LCHS did not have the "late arrival" nor "early release" course activated in the 2019 school year. There is a large difference in the number of students with those courses on their schedule in the 2020 and 2021 school years.
