<b><i>When are student results being provided to students?</i></b>	Student Score reports were handed back the weeks of January 6th and 13th. Students absent during this time received (or will receive) their score reports the week of January 21st.	Student score reports were delivered with original test booklets during the first week after winter break.	We pass scores back to students through their advisories during the week they are received.
<b><i>How are results being personalized?</i></b>	All students received training/information on how to understand their score reports. This included an introduction to online resources, College and Career Benchmarks, AP Potential and score breakdowns. Prior to taking the PSAT students currently enrolled in 9th, 10th and 11th grade English classes here at CHS received additional information about why we take PSAT, why they are important and how they can use their results to set secondary and personal post-secondary goals.	Students were shown a video from the <a href="#">College Board</a> that provides information on how to interpret a score and how to link College Board to Khan Academy for individualized practice; most juniors linked their accounts when we worked through Career Cruising activities in December.  Additionally, students could request an appointment with the college and career advisor for more information or assistance.	Advisory teachers go over scores with students.
<b><i>How are parents/guardians involved in the process?</i></b>	CHS will be hosting a PSAT parent night January 22 from 6pm-8pm. This event will cover how to understand the PSAT Score report and how to support their student moving forward. After the parent night an email will be sent to all CHS parents (9th,10th and 11th grade) with information regarding PSAT. Additionally, Junior parents will receive an email regarding SATs and how to help students prepare etc.	An email was sent that same week letting them know that scores were provided to students and how to interpret them. The same College Board video was linked in the video.	We email parents that their students are receiving their scores.
<b><i>Are students getting logged on to Khan Academy as part of this practice?</i></b>	Juniors enrolled in an English class at CHS have created both a College Board account and a Khan Academy account. Additionally, they all synced their most recent PSAT scores to Khan Academy to create a personalized SAT prep program. Based on their post-secondary goals, juniors began the process of developing a goal for the SAT. Juniors will also be receiving an email regarding	Yes, this is a standard practice for most Juniors as part of the Career Cruising activities.	We have a class, "College Prep" for students specifically to work on developing a variety of skills that will help them with college and post-secondary training. This class includes using Khan Academy to practice questions. Additionally, we have a one hour extended learning period each week. During this time, juniors can join an advisory that is using Khan academy for test practice.

<b><i>How are results/question analyses being used by your leadership and departments (specifically in ELA/Math courses)?</i></b>	I am not aware of any departmental plans for results analysis - I know some teachers have used the scores and Khan academy in the past.	Teachers are provided access to use the questions/results if they wish.	Math and ELA classes use SAT style questions as part of their daily instruction.
<b><i>What kinds of check-ins are occurring after results are received and before SAT (specifically for Juniors)</i></b>	We will be visiting with Juniors at the end of the school year to discuss post-secondary educational and financial options. Through this process Juniors will review their SAT scores and determine if they have successfully attained the score needed for them to pursue their post-secondary goals. If they have not, we work with them to determine the best ways to improve their scores and when they should consider re-taking the SAT or ACT.	An SAT preparatory course was provided last spring for all Juniors. A similar course may be available in the spring.	As stated above, we have a college prep class, one hour of extended learning per week, and daily instruction to help students improve their skills prior to taking the SAT test.
