



Date: May 19, 2020 Re: SORA Usage

A major concern during remote learning has been providing students access to reading. Coeur d'Alene Public Schools has been working on two fronts to address this issue: the first is through free books distributed to students alongside free lunches at meal sites, and the second is through increasing the number of titles and copies of books in SORA, which is Coeur d'Alene Public Schools' online library. Reading through SORA has increased significantly during the soft closure.

In a 30 day period from February to March 2020, which included the first few days of the soft closure, the total number of hours read was 569 hours. That amount more than quadrupled to 2,398 hours in a 30 day period from April 19 to May 19, 2020 (notice the values on the y axis are different).





The number of checkouts is much higher than any previous year, and there are still three fewer months (June, July and August), unaccounted for in this year's usage statistics:
