MINIMAL RISK LEVEL
 What does it mean, how are schools operating?

Moderate and/or sustained community transmission with likelihood of confirmed exposure within communal settings, and with potential for increase in suspected cases.

Traditional learning is in effect: Students attend class days a week. Masks required for everyone when on school property and buses. Maximize use of outdoor learning spaces, large spaces such as gyms and cafeterias. Social distancing as is practical.

Traditional Learning
 Students attend in person 4 days a week



Maximize Space
 Maximum use of outdoor learning spaces, large interior spaces



Social Distancing
 Maximize social distancing to the extent practicable



Visitor Restrictions
 Limit non-essential visitors, volunteers and activities



Illness Screening
 Students self-screen for symptoms before coming to school



Stay Home If Sick
 Anyone with COVID symptoms stays home, self-isolates



Masks Required
 Students and staff wear masks at school, on bus



Handwashing
 Handwashing and use of hand sanitizer



Athletics
 Pod practice structure, only local competitions



Extracurricular
 Masks and 6 foot distancing required for clubs, field trips



Student Meals
 Grab-and-go meals available for students when at home



Family Support
 Virtual parent support for social and emotional learning
