Graded classwork is 20% of your grade and will be assigned periodically as practice for the content we're learning. Classwork is given full credit if it's complete and on-time. Quizzes are 80% of your grade and will be given at the end of each topic which will be roughly every 2-3 weeks. You can use any notes taken in class or any classwork completed to help you on quizzes. Also, you may retake a quiz ONCE to get a higher score. You may also get help from me between quizzes! Your grade is your responsibility. You should never wonder why you have a certain grade. Come to class, take notes, do the work, ask for help, pass the quizzes. Boom.
