School and Community Overview: The city of Coeur d'Alene is located along the western slope of the Rockies. The presence of Lake Coeur d'Alene and Hayden Lake, the mountains and rural population all blend to give us a vacation resort atmosphere. Leisure activities include boating, fishing, hunting, skiing and golf. Forestry, tourism and hospitality services are our main income producers. Coeur d'Alene is the central location for a major hospital and a junior college. Lake City High School is one of the two public high schools serving the community of Coeur d'Alene and has roughly 1,600 students. We have 80 faculty members, four & a half administrators, five guidance counselors, a school psychologist and a college & career advisor. Lake City High School is accredited by COGNIA and is considered a Four-Star school, being publicly recognized and celebrated for excellent performance as a top-performing school throughout the state of Idaho.

Lake City High School offers an extensive co-curricular activities program and is a member of the Idaho High School Activities Association. Our school holds a 5A athletic classification, the largest Idaho school designation. Opportunities for participation exist in both athletic and non-athletic venues. Athletic activities include football, cross country, soccer, volleyball, swimming, lacrosse, basketball, softball, wrestling, baseball, track, tennis and golf. Non-athletic activities include music, debate, speech, drama, cheerleading, and a variety of clubs.

Lake City High School offers 10 Advanced Placement (AP) courses, which include: AP Literature, AP English Language & Composition, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Statistics, AP US History, AP Government, AP European History, AP World History, and AP Spanish Language/Culture. Honors classes are held in Freshman English, Sophomore English, Spanish 3, French 3, Latin 3, Debate, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy & Physiology, World History, Math 1, Math 2, Math 3, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Art Studio and Art History.

Lake City High School is on the semester system with one (1) credit earned per class per semester. We are on a rotating 4 period block schedule for a total of eight classes per semester. Coeur d'Alene School District has a 90% attendance rule. Credit can be lost due to absences; however students have the right to pass a competency test to retain credits lost due to attendance.
