Spelling Focus for the Week of: 10/16 - 10/20

Contractions

There are five secrets to spelling contractions correctly!

1. A contraction is two words combined to make a shorter word.

2. The first word and last letter of the second word stay the same.

(Notice that the word \underline{does} remains unchanged and that doesn't ends in \underline{t} from not)

3. An apostrophe takes the place of at least one letter.

(Notice an apostrophe takes the place of the h & a in the second word have)

4. The apostrophe usually takes the place of a vowel.

(Notice the apostrophe took the place of vowel I in the contraction)

5. The contraction sounds the way it is spelled!
